As of July 13, **7,804** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Currently in ICU level care in hospital: **1**
- Deaths in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic: **157**

OVERDOSE PREVENTION & RESPONSE

Take Home Naloxone and the effects of extreme heat

Elevated temperatures like those of British Columbia's recent record-breaking heat wave present a threat to expandable goods such as Naloxone. Naloxone can become less potent and ultimately spoil if exposed to extreme heat.

It is recommended that Naloxone is stored between 15°C-30°C and to be kept in a dark place. Research has shown naloxone can be safely used after hot and cold stresses. If the Naloxone is repeatedly outside the recommended temperature range, we advise going to a THN site and replacing the ampoules. The replacement process for expired naloxone should be followed for more details see <http://towardtheheart.com>.

If the only naloxone available is known to have been outside recommended temperatures (or is past its expiry date) **use it**. It may not be as effective but **do not delay** and wait for additional help to arrive. If someone is having an opioid overdose they need naloxone as soon as possible.

Phase 3 for doctor's offices

BC has entered phase 3 of the Restart Plan, which means some restrictions have eased for the public when it comes to wearing masks. However, there are no changes for doctors' offices.

Family doctors, specialists, staff, patients and visitors to community practices must continue to wear medical masks as set out in the provincial government's mask policy.

Applications open for active transportation infrastructure grants

The Province is committing \$36 million to active transportation infrastructure projects over the



next three years, helping to create more liveable and sustainable communities throughout British Columbia.

[Applications to receive up to \\$500,000 are open from June 24 to July 30, 2021](#). The percentage of provincial funding is determined by a cost-share sliding scale that supports Indigenous communities and communities with a smaller population tax base.
