COVID-19 Provincial case counts and statements

As of May 11, **7,369** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Cases currently active: **134**
- New cases: **12**
- Currently in hospital: **11**
- Currently in ICU-level care in hospital: **5**
- Deaths in the region since the beginning of the pandemic: **143**

COVID-19 update for BC Hydro Site C project

Ongoing monitoring and testing have not identified any new cases of COVID-19 associated with an outbreak declared by NH Medical Health Officers on April 28, 2021, among contracted workforces on the Site C hydroelectric dam project in Northeast BC.

To date, there have been 39 lab-confirmed cases identified among clusters of COVID-19 activity involving various contractors. There have been no new cases since the previous update (May 7).

There are currently no active cases associated with the outbreak; all 39 individuals who had tested positive in association with the outbreak, have recovered. A small number of close contacts are completing their required self-isolation.

YOUR HEALTH, A PRIORITY
